Edmonton, AB.— United Protection Services Inc. (UPS) the operating company of United Protection Security Group Inc. (UPSG trades as TSX-V, UZZ), is ramping up for another busy fall and winter season as resource exploration companies and manufacturers prepare for the freezing of the ground. A prime time to lay pipe, move rigs and add to infrastructure.

The reason UPS is a leader in this area of service delivery can be traced back to 1984 when CEO Sig Jorstad, a home grown entrepreneurial Albertan, broke and out of work in a decimated oil patch at the time, teamed up with an ex Chief of Police and formed "The Security Officer Career College Inc. (SOCC). The first contract they were awarded was federally funded to provide entry level Basic Security Guard Training to twenty Aboriginal women wanting to enter, or re-enter, the work force. For the next five years, hundreds of First Nations, Métis and non-Aboriginal Private Security Guards were graduated from the College. In the meantime SOCC had become certified as a Private Vocational College by Alberta Advanced Education, adding to the value of the Certificate at that time.

In 1989 one of the On-the-Job Training Place Hosts for the College, a small Mobile K-9 Security Patrol Service, got into trouble and enticed Jorstad into taking them over for One Dollar! (This marked the beginning of United Protection Services Inc., or UPS for short as its become known), one car, one dog, and one guard. Success from that point on speaks for itself. Business boomed, Branch offices opened across the West and United became a serious player almost overnight. The Branch Office in Lloydminster, (Jorstad's hometown), hired a bright young First Nation Aboriginal by the name of Earl John in 1995, as a guard; next as the Manager and then as the Owner Operator of the Branch. Earl John is now Vice-President of the United First Nations Corp Business Development Division of United and Owner Operator of the UFNC that provides the First Nations and Métis labour force for the Company, which currently contribute over 35% of the total revenues generated by United Protection Services.

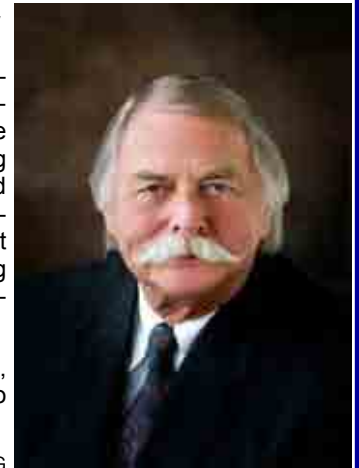
This is a tremendous testimonial to the working relationships that have developed between motivated and inspired individuals from different cultures, working and growing together under the "United umbrella". Incubated in the Security Officer Career College, assembled and managed by the UFNC and employed by United, all dedicated to providing Private Protection Professionals to clients in every industry and every sector of the economy.

Speak to Earl John about this story and he illuminates the pathway that so many First Nations and Métis have gravitated to. "I grabbed on with both hands and hundreds have followed me," John stated. "When you figure each employee in our business division averages \$41,000 in annual income, that is a \$50 million dollar swing over five years in the economy with persons who were mostly on support income before we offered them the opportunity to partner with us in serving clients who want to work with these communities in many remote geographic areas". There are no losers in this business model. And with the expansion of pipelines across our country Earl's group is poised to benefit their employees, their customers, and United!

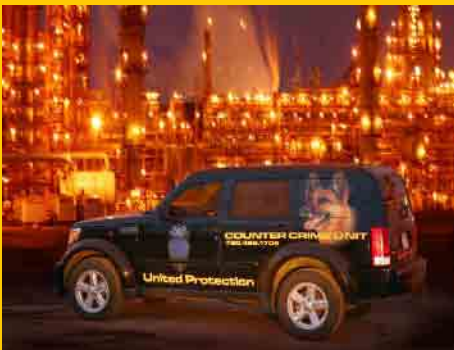
